HASTINGS BOYS' HIGH SCHOOL COLOURS

1. The award of the Colour is to recognise a boy's contribution to the school in a particular area. Only full colour awards are given to senior students (Year 12 and 13). Year 9, 10 and 11 students will receive a junior colour certificate. 1st and 2nd year tiered awards will be given to reflect consistency of service over time.
2. Nominations for the award will be made by the supervising teacher of the activity. These will be considered by the **Awards Committee** who will make recommendations for awards to the Headmaster. Awards will only be distributed three times throughout the year at the special Colours assemblies.
3. There will be five broad categories within which awards will be made:
Leadership - Sport – Academic – Culture – Community

The awards will not be made to a boy who has not obeyed basic school rules and discipline (attendance – including attendance at practices, uniform, behaviour). Applications are to be submitted to the school office. Forms are available from the office and the school website.

Honours Caps, Ties and Blazers

Honours Caps

Will be presented to Year 13 Students, who must have played consistently a minimum of 2 years and must have no pastoral or attendance concerns. These are available for **1st XV Rugby, 1st XI Cricket, 1st XI Football, 1st XI Hockey and Senior Premier Basketball**. Other **codes** can be considered on merit. Due consideration must be given to long term service, commitment to the team and leadership on and off the field.

Honours Tie

Will be presented sparingly, and only to Year 12 or 13 students, with the following as guidelines:

- Head Boy
- Dux
- A minimum of **three colours** but from **two different areas**
- Sportsman of the Year
- National representation in culture (committee decision)
- National sports representation at age group level (committee decision)

Akina Honours Blazer

Philosophy

Hastings Boys' High School aims to recognise excellence across the whole range of activities available to students at Hastings Boys' High School, with a view to confirming the pursuit of excellence and the building of self-esteem in students. Students must receive an Honours Tie before being eligible for an Honours Blazer.



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1. **Eligibility**

The student must be a Prefect and obtain a minimum of two other colours from two different areas: Academic, Sport, Culture, Community.

2. Recipients must display at all times:

1. Akina Man Values
2. Participation: fully involved in school life and community and in awarded areas
3. Loyalty to the school in that particular code / discipline.
4. To be considered for an Akina Blazer students are expected to represent the School in all five colours areas where possible. However, when the School cannot provide the level of competition/context to enable the student to fulfil his potential, a dispensation may be granted after **discussion, and will be decided on merit.**

3. Nominees must demonstrate in class and around the school;

1. The Akina Man Values. Students with poor behaviour in school, no matter how well they behave and act within their particular code/discipline, will **NOT** be considered for an Honours Blazer.
2. Attendance: Meet the school expectation of 80%, with no unjustified absences.
3. Meet all uniform and appearance criteria.
4. Must have met all financial deadlines or have appropriate arrangements made.

Headmaster's Discretion

A TIC of an activity may submit to the Headmaster information about any individual who does not fit within the BLAZER criteria. He may be awarded an Honours Blazer under the Headmaster's discretion.

The Headmaster, after consultation with the Colours Committee has the right to withdraw the Honours Blazer (after they have been awarded) if Clause 3.1 or 3.2 are no longer being satisfied.
